Status of the Ukrainian nuclear power plants and the nuclear industry of Ukraine

- According to SE "NNEGC "Energoatom", as of February 27, 2023, 9 power units of Ukrainian nuclear power plants, which are located on the territory controlled by Ukraine, worked to meet the needs of the population and the country's economy.
- The russians are blocking the connection of power units of the temporarily occupied Zaporizhzhya nuclear power plant, which continues to consume more than 100 MW of electricity for its own needs from the energy system of Ukraine.

Current situation on Zaporizhzhya NPP

- According to the SE "NNEGC "Energoatom" as of February 27, 2023, the Zaporizhzhya NPP received power for its in-house needs from the energy system of Ukraine. The radiation situation at the ZNPP site remains normal.
- Energoatom calls on the world's community to contribute to the withdrawal of russian soldiers from the premises of the ZNPP and the city of Energodar, demilitarisation of the plant and bringing it back it under full control of Ukraine, as the occupiers being present at the ZNPP threatens Ukraine with an environmental and nuclear disaster.

Current situation on Chernobyl NPP and in the Exclusion Zone

- On February 27, 2023, the radiation situation at the ChNPP site was without changes. The monitored parameters of the equipment were within the boundaries set by the technological regulations. Operating personnel continues to ensure nuclear and radiation safety.

War in Ukraine

- The 369 day of the resistance of Ukraine to the russian military invasion has ended.
- According to the General Staff of the Armed Forces of Ukraine, the russian federation continues to conduct full-scale armed aggression against Ukraine. The main efforts are focused on conducting offensive operations on the Kupiansk, Lyman, Bakhmut, Avdiivka and Shakhtarsk fronts [eastern fronts], and increasing the number of personnel. According to available information, up to 200 conscripts from Rostov Oblast [russian federation] have been transferred to the temporarily occupied territory of Luhansk Oblast.
- During the current day, the russian army carried out 8 missile and 28 air strikes, 12 of them with Iranian Shahed-136 attack UAVs; and also carried out more than 55 attacks from multiple-launch rocket systems.
- The Air Force of the Defence Forces of Ukraine launched 4 strikes on the areas of

concentration of personnel and military equipment of the invaders. Also, Ukrainian soldiers destroyed 9 out of 12 Iranian Shahed-136 and 1 Zala attack UAVs during the current day.

- On the northern fronts, the tactical situation remains unchanged, and no offensive group formation has been spotted. In the border areas of Bryansk and Kursk oblasts [Russian Federation], Russia is carrying out engineering equipment of the area, in particular anti-tank ditches.
- On the Zaporizhzhya front, areas of 17 settlements were hit by Russian fire. On the Kherson front, more than 20 settlements of Kherson Oblast, located on the right [west] bank of the Dnipro River, were affected by artillery fire from the Russian occupation forces.
- Air-raid warnings were issued in the city of Kyiv and Kyiv Oblast, as well as in a number of other oblasts, on the late evening of Sunday, 26 February. Later, it became known that Russia attacked Ukraine with Shahed drones from Bryansk Oblast, Russia.
- According to the Ukrainian Air Force, the Defence Forces of Ukraine shot down 11 Shahed Iranian-made kamikaze drones out of 14 launched on the night of 26 February. Nine drones were shot down in the airspace around Kyiv, reported Head of Kyiv City Military Administration.
- The Ukrainian Air Force notes that the Russians are now using Iranian-made Shahed attack drones to track down and deplete Ukrainian air defence systems - Yuriy Ihnat, spokesperson for the Air Force of Ukraine, explained why the occupiers are launching Shahed drones again.
- The Russian occupiers are increasing the intensity of assault operations, the most difficult for Ukraine's Defence Forces is the Bakhmut front.
- Two emergency workers had been killed and four more have been wounded in Russian strikes on the city of Khmelnytskyi on the night of 26-27 February.
- Over 1 million hectares of agricultural land mined in Kharkiv and Kherson oblasts.
