Status of the Ukrainian nuclear power plants and the nuclear industry of Ukraine

- According to SE NNEGC Energoatom, on October 4-5, 2023 power units of Ukrainian nuclear power plants, which are located on the territory controlled by Ukraine, worked to meet the needs of the population and the country's economy.

Current situation on Zaporizhzhya NPP

- According to the SE NNEGC Energoatom as of October 4-5, 2023, the Zaporizhzhya NPP received power for its in-house needs from the energy system of Ukraine. As of 08:00 on October 5, 2023, the radiation state at the Zaporizhzhya NPP was within the current norms.
- SE NNEGC Energoatom reports that as of 08:00 on October 4-5, the water level in the cooling pond of Zaporizhzhya NPP was 15.79 m. The situation remains stable and under control.

War in Ukraine

- On October 5, 2023, is the 589 day of the resistance of Ukraine to the russian military invasion.
- According to the General Staff of the Armed Forces of Ukraine On October 5, Ukraine's Defence Forces are on the defensive in Ukraine's east and south, conducting the offensive operation on the Melitopol front and offensive actions on the Bakhmut front, consolidating their positions.
- During the past 24 hours, 37 combat clashes took place at the front. In total, the russian army carried out three missile strikes and 65 airstrikes, and another 50 attacks from multiple-launch rocket systems both on the positions of Ukrainian troops and on civilian targets. Over 110 settlements in Chernihiv, Sumy, Kharkiv, Luhansk, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhya and Kherson oblasts came under artillery fire.
- the russian forces on the night of October 5-6 attacked Ukraine with Shahed drones from Cape Chauda in temporarily occupied Crimea. The launches of 33 Shahed drones were recorded. Several drone groups were flying toward Ukraine's southern, eastern and central oblasts. Fighter aircraft, anti-aircraft missile forces, units of mobile fire groups and radioelectronic warfare were involved in repelling the air attack.
- On October 5, russian troops attacked a cafe and a store in the village of Hroza, Kharkiv Oblast. 51 deaths were confirmed.
- russian forces also attacked the settlement of Vovchansk, Kharkiv Oblast, on October 6. Three people were injured as a result of the strike. The russian military attacked the village of Shevchenkove in Kharkiv Oblast with a Tornado-S multiple rocket launcher in the morning, leaving one person injured.

- Two civilians were killed in a Russian attack on the city of Kherson on October 5. The Russians struck the city from the occupied territory of Kherson Oblast. The Russians again attacked residential buildings in the centre of the city of Kherson at around 05:00 on 6 October.
- Russian forces hit the centre of the city of Kharkiv on the morning of October 6. A ten-year-old boy and his mother were killed. Thirty people were injured. The condition of most of the injured, including the child, is moderate. The majority of people suffered from blast injuries, shrapnel wounds to their arms and legs, faces, and bruises. Emergency services continue to work at the scene of the attack.
- Western rocket and artillery systems have enabled the Ukrainian Armed Forces to create a long-range "fire fist" that impedes the Russian army's ability to effectively conduct counter-battery operations.

Details: Baranov said that the pillars of modern artillery are the highest level of automation, the latest digital developments for artillery reconnaissance, automated fire control systems and counter-battery weapons. Nowadays, the absolute majority, sometimes up to 90%, of the fire damage to Russian forces and equipment falls on rocket forces and artillery, the officer noted. The brigadier general also stated that Ukrainians are mastering Western artillery systems many times faster than stipulated by NATO standards.
