Status of the Ukrainian nuclear power plants and the nuclear industry of Ukraine

- According to SE NNEGC Energoatom, on October 9, 2023 power units of Ukrainian nuclear power plants, which are located on the territory controlled by Ukraine, worked to meet the needs of the population and the country's economy.

Current situation on Zaporizhzhya NPP

- According to the SE NNEGC Energoatom as of October 9, 2023, the Zaporizhzhya NPP received power for its in-house needs from the energy system of Ukraine. As of 08:00 on October 9, 2023, the radiation state at the Zaporizhzhya NPP was within the current norms.
- SE NNEGC Energoatom reports that as of 08:00 on October 9, the water level in the cooling pond of Zaporizhzhya NPP was 15.76 m. The situation remains stable and under control.

Current situation on Chernobyl NPP and in the Exclusion Zone

- On October 9, 2023, the radiation situation at the ChNPP site was without changes. The monitored parameters of the equipment were within the boundaries set by the technological regulations. Operating personnel continues to ensure nuclear and radiation safety.

War in Ukraine

- On October 9, 2023, is the 593 day of the resistance of Ukraine to the russian military invasion.
- According to the General Staff of the Armed Forces of Ukraine on October 9, Ukrainian defenders repelled more than 30 attacks from different directions.
- The Defence Forces of Ukraine continued their assault operations south of the city of Bakhmut in Donetsk Oblast. They had partial success in the area of Andriivka in Donetsk Oblast, consolidating their positions. On the Avdiivka and Mariinka fronts in Donetsk Oblast, the russians carried out more than 15 unsuccessful attacks. Heavy fighting continues in the north of the city of Avdiivka.
- On the Zaporizhzhya front, Ukrainian defenders are holding back the russians near Levadne in Zaporizhzhya Oblast. Also on October 9, russian troops conducted a limited, unsuccessful offensive in western Zaporizhzhya Oblast.
- The Ukrainian defence forces continue to advance on the Melitopol front, inflicting losses in manpower and equipment on the russian forces, consolidating their positions and exhausting the invaders.
- On the northern fronts, the operational situation remains without significant

changes. The russians are maintaining a military presence in the border areas and are actively conducting subversive activities to prevent the deployment of Ukrainian troops to threatened areas.

- On the night of October 9-10, russian occupation forces attacked the south of Ukraine with 36 Shahed attack UAVs. The launches were carried out from Cape Chauda (temporarily occupied Crimea). It is reported that 27 russian drones were destroyed within Odesa, Mykolaiv and Kherson oblasts.
- During the past day, the russians also fired artillery, mortars and used aviation at the settlements of the Kharkiv, Chuhuiiv, and Kupiansk districts of the Kharkiv region, damaged houses, and power lines.
- At least two Ukrainian civilians have been killed and 22 more people injured during the past day due to military actions by the russian army.
- Ukraine's Air Defence Forces will actively use their efforts this winter to protect the energy sector, strategic state facilities and critical infrastructure facilities. Source: Yurii Ihnat, Spokesman for the Ukrainian Air Force. Ihnat emphasised that there is a list of facilities that could be potential targets for the russians. Ihnat also said it should be taken into account that the food sector should be included in the list of critical infrastructure facilities, as it is one of the targets for potential russian attacks. Ihnat noted that Ukraine still lacks appropriate defence systems, so it uses all available means to down air targets.
- Finland is spending an additional EUR 92 million to support Ukraine and countries affected by russian aggression, the country's Foreign Ministry said on Monday, October 9. The funds allocated by Finland will be directed to the Crisis Fund of the International Development Association (IDA) of the World Bank Group, created at the beginning of the year to expand support for Ukraine and Moldova, as well as other countries affected by the russian aggression against Ukraine.
